After the British won the battle of Brooklyn and occupied Long Island, Major Benjamin Tallmadge led a series of successful military raids to harass the British troops. General George Washington also tapped Tallmadge to lead an espionage ring of Long Island spies. Local historian Rob von Bernewitz discusses Setauket-born Benjamin Tallmadge and the Culper Spy Ring's significant role in winning the war. Take a photographic journey of sites along today's Tallmadge Trail during the raid on the British Fort St. George in Mastic and the burning of the hay in Coram.
